Accommodations: The housing will be determined once we have a worksite assigned; it can be dorm style, air mattress or sleeping bags. If you have a medical condition that doesn't allow you to sleep in sleeping bags or on an air mattress, please let me know. The PR coordinator will try her best to assign the group to a "dorm-style close to a house." I will share all the housing details before departure. Please note, this is a mission trip and accommodations are very basic.

You are responsible for your stay if you do not arrive at housing the same time as your group.

Missional Class to Prepare for Deployment: This class will take place within one month prior to deployment.

Mission Details: The worksites will be assigned two weeks before your arrival. Churches are priorities for rebuilding because they also operate as shelters. However, this is a dynamic process and is changing every day dependent upon the necessities of the churches, the availability of materials, the skills of the volunteers, or if a group finished work or not, among others. All mission details are provided by the Puerto Rico Volunteer Coordinator.
